
We have begun plans for a Ladies Luncheon on Saturday, July 16. Watch for details in a special announcement.

Answer to "Masonic Trivia": (Thanks and a tip-o-the-cap to WB Danny Hayman for asking me the question!) According to Mackey's Encyclopedia of Freemasonry, the term "...signifies to make valid or legal. Hence one who has received a Degree in an irregular manner or from incompetent authority is not recognized until he has been 'healed.' The precise mode of healing depends on circumstances. If the Lodge which conferred the Degree was clandestine, the whole ceremony...would have to be repeated. If the authority which conferred the Degree was only irregular, and the question was merely a technical one of legal competence, it is only necessary to exact an obligation of allegiance, or in other words to renew the covenant."
